





Early Learning Summary

- ☐ Failure to anticipate and act early
- ☐ Failure to accept reality and worst-case scenario
- ☐ Lack of investment in preparedness at a national level
- ☐ Generational resistance to remote working
- ☐ Planning assumptions based on staff absence levels and on building occupiers coming back
- Complexity of job support schemes and cutting costs fast and early will no doubt find its way into future planning
- ☐ Insurance coverage confusion



Improve your plans **NOW** not next year

- ☐ Conduct or review your Business Impact Analysis at a high level to ensure you are using your budget to prioritise the right areas
- ☐ People centric plans
- ☐ Review and refresh do not reinvent
- ☐ Loss of People / IT / Buildings
- ☐ Remote working review
- ☐ Involve your cleaning team or provider
- ☐ Work on the assumption of another lockdown and what you would do different this time
- □ Survey or debrief <u>all your staff</u> / customers to capture learning, it is not only managers that have the best ideas/solutions DEBRIEF LEARN IDENTIFY -
